

RESOLUTION 625

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF KALAMA, WASHINGTON DECLARING THE 1991 CHEVROLET BLAZER, TWO COMPUTER SERVERS AND THREE DESKTOP COMPUTERS; TWO WHELEN STROBE LIGHT BARS, HALOGEN DIRECTIONAL ARROW STICKS, AND ITEMS FROM THE NEW CITY HALL BUILDING INCLUDING OLD SAFETY DEPOSIT BOXES, A SAFE, AND THE STEEL VAULT DOOR SURPLUS AND AUTHORIZING DISPOSAL IN THE CITY OF KALAMA'S BEST INTEREST.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KALAMA, WASHINGTON DO RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The provision of the Resolution shall be deemed to be an exercise of the power of the City of Kalama to declare property surplus as provided for under Kalama Municipal Code, Chapter 3.52.
