ORDINANCE NO. 1379

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KALAMA, WASHINGTON AMENDING THE 2016 BUDGET TO ACCOUNT FOR INCREASING THE BUDGET IN THE AMOUNT OF \$90.000

Whereas, the City of Kalama approved Ordinance No. 1371 adopting the 2016 Budget and 2016 – 2021 Capital Facilities Plan on December 2, 2015;

Whereas, the City of Kalama is growing and expanding which will require additional personnel to continue to provide the level of service to insure the health, safety and welfare of its citizens;

Whereas, the City of Kalama recognizes that the current staffing level of the Kalama Police Department needs to be increased in order to address the needs of the community and to ensure that our officers are not over-extended due to excess overtime needed to provide 24-hour coverage;

Whereas, the City of Kalama Mayor has authorized the Chief of Police to look for applicants to fill a new position in the department and one applicant has emerged that will be a lateral officer and a good fit for the Department,

Whereas, the City of Kalama has been renovating the new City Hall facility and has had unanticipated costs for asbestos abatement and other unexpected remodeling costs;

Now Therefore the City Council of the City of Kalama do ordain as follows:

Section 1 The 2016 Budget is increased to \$8,250,875.00 as shown on the attached Exhibit A including all transfers and adjustments to ending fund balance estimates.

- **Section 2** The 2016 Salary Schedule attached as Exhibit B is amended to include the addition of a fourth officer to the Police Department at the Post Academy salary level in the contract.
- **Section 3** Acts taken by authorized officers and staff of the City, pursuant to this ordinance, but prior to its effective date are hereby ratified and confirmed. The appropriations made in this ordinance are necessary to accommodate the unanticipated revenues and expenditures.
- **Section 4** Severability If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining parts of this ordinance.
- **Section 5** This ordinance shall become effective five days after passage, approval, and publication as provided by law.
