Hi Pete,

Thanks for your phone call; quite unexpected but appreciated. Here's a proposal for the council to consider. I think it's a win/win for you and the city council and the population in the surrounding area. I hope you find this positive and constructive as a step to help present information to allow the public to be informed, not only of the methanol plant per se, but, also to direct the public to the proper platform(s) that are involved with this proposal.

My intent is to give the city the opportunity to be involved, get a feeling from the of the area folks, and not make the city be seen in a negative light. It is not our intention to cause any divisiveness, nor to allow unruly behavior. We see this as a disruption of community values and individual opinions.

So, I am submitting the following, as you requested, as a resolution for the city to place on the next council meeting's agenda.

Kalama City Council

PROPOSAL: Schedule a town hall/ workshop, Involving the council and the local area public to learn about the proposed methanol refinery at the Port of Kalama. The workshop would be open to the public. During the event the City Council would be able to interact with informal public input or "testimony" if that is allowed under city rules for workshops. The city attorney would be responsible for sourcing information for the workshop however anyone may submit information they wish to be included in the workshop materials. Presentations by organizations may be allowed if desired.

OUTCOME: A more informed council and citizenry. If the council is motivated by the information, they could move, in a future meeting, to consider a non-binding resolution on the proposed methanol refinery.
