## NEW COUNCILMEMBERS TAKE OFFICE IN JANUARY WHO ARE THEY?

In **Position No. 1 is Jon Stanfill** who was appointed to fill the seat vacated by Mike Truesdell in August of 2019. He is excited to "pursue new opportunities for economic development and community outreach in Kalama". Jon will be working with the staff at the Police Department and serving on the Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors in 2020. He states, "I'm looking forward to working with Chief Herrera as the council's liaison to the Police Department, especially as we collaborate to establish more neighborhood watch groups in Kalama—thereby enhancing our community's safety and strengthening the relations between our citizens and our police officers. Matthew will be working with staff on Planning and Economic Development Downtown in 2020.


