Mayor Reuter and the Kalama City Council have designated the week of May 10<sup>th</sup> as National Police Week in Kalama to honor the service, dedication and sacrifice of our own Kalama Police Officers as well as officers nationwide. In honor of Police Week, Kalama would like you to get to know the members of your Department.





My name is Rafael "Ralph" Herrera and I am the Kalama Police Chief. I was hired by the City of Kalama in July of 2017. I am 42 years old, married, and we have two boys, ages 12 and 8.
