SUMMER SEWER RATES NOW IN EFFECT

Do you raise a garden in the summer? Water your lawn? Fill a swimming pool? Other activities that use additional water? These are the reasons the City established a summer sewer rate back in the 1970's. How does it work?

Regular sewer rates are based on the water consumption as metered. For the utility bills sent out in June through September, the City allows the sewer rates to include only the average winter water usage plus 10%, instead of charging the sewer on 100% of the water used. This recognizes that water for gardens and pools does not go through the sewer system for processing. So, enjoy a green lawn and stay cool in your pool!

My name is **Steve Parker** and I am currently the police sergeant for the Kalama Police Department. I started as a temporary officer on July 2, 1999 and was hired full time on December 15, 1999, after having served for 5 years as a deputy for the Cowlitz County Sheriff's Office. I was promoted to sergeant in September 2004 and have served as acting police chief on several occasions. I was also the department's narcotics detection K9 handler, working with K9 Bati

from 2007 to 2010, and K9 Amy from 2011 to 2014. During my time in Kalama, I have witnessed much growth in the city and the police department, and I am proud to have been a part of improving the overall image of the police department within the law enforcement community.

I was born and raised in Montana and after graduating high school in 1985, I started college at Montana State University to pursue a degree in electrical engineering. Life intervened and I ended up moving to Washington in 1988 while taking a break from college. I worked security at Trojan Nuclear Power Plant from 1988 to 1993 and met several retired police officers and a few current reserve officers, which started my interest in a law enforcement career. After a few "ride-alongs" and a short stint as a reserve deputy, I was hooked and did not return to school for engineering. I transferred my college credits to Centralia College and added a few more courses there to complete my Associate of Technical Arts degree in law enforcement in 1999. My father was a parts department manager for several auto dealerships over his career, so I grew up around cars and learned to work on them myself. In fact, it was a requirement upon getting my first car that I performed all the maintenance on it. This led to my hobby of working on my own vehicles, fixing them up and occasionally taking them to the drag strip to race. I still have my high school graduation present (and second car), which was my mom's 1972 Dodge Charger SE. You may have seen it a couple of times at the Kalama car show.
