OPENING

MINUTES

NEW BUSINESS – Future Zoning Code Amendments

Chairperson Fortuna asked Planner Floyd to give a brief overview on what the Commission will be discussing next. Planner Floyd explained that the City Council has requested the Planning Commission turn their focus to a second package of amendments to the Kalama Municipal Code. Recommended areas of investigation are listed below, and staff will be providing an overview of each issue at the February 13th meeting.

- Taking a broad look at public noticing requirements, including methods and standards.
- Removing potential ambiguities in the definition of setbacks as identified by the Hearings Examiner in a recent variance application.
- The appeal process outlined under KMC 2.34.150 (Appeal from the Examiners Decision) directs appeals to Cowlitz County Superior Court, which some may perceive to be in conflict with KMC 17.12.050 (Appeals) where applicants can appeal to the City Council.
- Clarification from the Planning Commission regarding the Hearing Examiner's role vs. City Council's role related to KMC 15.02.180 (Reasonable Use Exception), 15.02.190 (Appeals), and 2.34.090(A)(4) - (Variances to Critical Areas Ordinance).
- Review code language and sample documents found in the Development Guidelines and Public Works Standards (DGPWS) November 2013, for Latecomer Agreement for infrastructure.
- Potential elimination of the detached sidewalk standard due to ongoing maintenance issues.

After some discussion the Commission has decided to start the review process on public

notice requirements.
