2021 -2025 Utility Rate Study

On November 5, 2020, the Kalama City Council will hold a public hearing on the Draft of the 2021-2025 Utility Rate Study prepared by consultants with HDR, Inc. The study looks at the City's utilities – water-sewer-stormwater – to determine if the current rates will meet the needs of operating and maintaining the existing systems and meet the growth needs for the future. Utilities are enterprise functions of the City that are funded by the rates paid for the services they provide. The City hires consultants to perform the study in order to obtain an un-biased appraisal of the rates and needs of each system. The hearing is to allow the public to hear the results of the study and to make comment.



The study includes a rate to cover inflation of 3% to meet wage, benefit and operating cost increases. It looks at the age of the existing infrastructure and any mandated improvements the City will need to make. It looks at the growth rate and projected growth or planned developments, both residential and commercial, to compare it to current capacity of the existing systems to determine

if, and/or when, expansion is needed. All of the costs related to all the functions of each utility are then compared to projected revenues the current rates will produce. If the rates will not meet the costs, then the consultants will calculate increases to the rates that will allow for revenues to meet the system needs. These are recommendations provided to the Council for consideration. While determining whether to increase rates or not, the Council will consider meeting the following factors: inflationary costs, mandated improvements,



needs for planned developments, and unexpected maintenance/needs of the system. They will likely also consider the effects a rate increase may have on the community and the potential impacts for the future of Kalama if they choose not to increase rates. This is a complex issue and a difficult decision. No one wants to see rate increases. Rates are driven by the needs of

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS 72-HOUR SURVIVAL KIT



What will you do if the power goes out? Grab a flashlight and a book to get through the next hour or two, or light a few candles and play a game with the family? What if the power is off for days due to an earthquake or other disaster, and you are not able to go anywhere, and help may not be available? Are you prepared? Most of us are probably not, as we just don't think this will happen. So how do we prepare ourselves? Cowlitz County Department of Emergency Management has the information available through their 3 Days3Ways campaign at:

This provides information to help families make a plan, which includes sheltering in place, supplies to have on hand to get through at least three days, and other information you may need. Water and food, medications, flashlights, a battery-operated radio, and first-aid supplies are just some of the items you may need. Prepare all family members with information on how to make contact if not together, or a meeting place set ahead of time. None of us expected to be isolated by the recent pandemic, but it happened. So, while we may never need it, a plan for survival during a disaster might just be in order. Go to the link above for more information on making a plan. 2021 Revenue Hearing November 5, 2020 & 2021 Budget & CFP Hearings November 19 & December 3, 2020



The Mayor and City staff are preparing the draft budget for the Council to consider at the upcoming public hearings. The public is encouraged to attend and make comments.

Revenues will be presented on November 5, 2020. This includes the 2021 Property tax levy – a 1% increase, as allowed by law, proposed increases to fees for planning applications, building permits and other fees, and other revenue sources of the City. This hearing will NOT include discussion of utility rate increases, as that will take place at a later date. The rate study will be discussed at this meeting in a separate public hearing.


The 2021 budget hearings will include a review of the draft capital facilities plan (CFP) for capital projects in all departments. It will cover what the needs and projected expenses are in each department including staffing, benefit costs, contracted costs, utilities, materials, chemicals, and operating overhead. There will be two hearings - one on November 19, 2020 and one on December 3, 2020 at 7pm via the virtual format Zoom. KALAMA PUBLIC LIBRARY-REOPENING??

The Governor's office and the State Department of Health have issued guidelines for partially opening libraries in Phase 2. The Kalama Library may be able to reopen soon. We are working to comply with the guidelines and safely reopen on a limited basis. When we open, you can expect to see new protocols in place. Only



four patrons will be allowed in the library at a time. Masks and social distancing will be required. Computer use will be limited. Days and hours of operation may vary. We will continue curbside pickup and encourage patrons to use this service. We understand that the community is anxious to see the library open. OPENING ON THE KALAMA PLANNING COMMISSION



Are you interested in how Kalama grows? Willing to commit some time to guide the growth of Kalama? The City of Kalama is taking applications to serve on the Kalama Planning Commission. The Planning Commission reviews land use and development codes for the City – reviews applications for land use and development, and makes recommendations back to the City Council. This job plays a vital part in determining the way growth in Kalama will proceed. The term for the commission is 6 years, and there are 7 positions – 5 from inside the city limits and 2 that can be from outside – either within the water service boundary or a Kalama business owner. Planning Commission meets on the second Thursday of each month. An application can be picked up at City Hall at 320 N.
