### RE-OPENING CITY HALL & COUNCIL CHAMBERS

City offices will re-open April 5<sup>th</sup>, 2021. City Council will hold hybrid meetings beginning April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021. Now that Washington state has moved to "Phase 3" of the Governor's re-opening plan, we will be opening City offices, the public library, community building, and City Council chambers for City Council meetings—with some limitations. Masks and social distancing will be required, and occupancy limits will be adhered to in all public buildings. City Hall office doors will be unlocked on April 5<sup>th</sup>, 2021 and will be open to walk-in services from 9am to 5pm.



Entry will be at the wheelchair access ramp on First Street and will exit through the main doors. Masks will be required to enter the building. The City Council will hold its first "hybrid" meeting (in-person/virtual mix) on April 1st, 2021—but is encouraging the public to attend virtually, as space in the Council Chambers is very limited due to social distancing requirements. There is only room for the Council and 3 staff members, plus 6-8 members of the public. If more members of the public want to attend in person than there is room for, the meeting will have to be adjourned and rescheduled as a virtual meeting due to the rules set out by the State. Masks will be required for all attendees, including Council and staff. The virtual meeting through Zoom will be open and attendance by this option will be available as it has for the past year.

## **PARKS & RECREATION CLASSES**

The City is excited to be looking at restarting the Yoga classes and to offer a Zumba Gold class beginning in May or June. Yoga classes with Ann will be a rejuvenating reunion! She is so excited to reconnect with students! Local Zumba instructor Ginger Roberts will be starting her

#### LIBRARY RE-OPENING

Beginning on Monday, April 5, 2021, the Kalama library staff welcomes patrons back to the library building. While we look forward to seeing people in person, we encourage patrons to continue use of curbside pickup. Services and days and hours of operation will be limited. The

library will be open Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 12 pm-3 pm. Masks will be required, and hand sanitizer must be used upon entry. Occupancy will be limited to five patrons at a time. Visits must be short: no longer than 15 minutes. Computer use will be limited (essential use only, at the librarian's discretion). Library cards may be issued or renewed. No group gatherings or programs. We still cannot accept book donations. As we open the doors, we ask for your patience and cooperation.
