HAVE YOU EVER WONDERED?

We get this question from time to time, so we figured we'd address it this month in a "Have You Ever Wondered?" themed article.... Have you ever wondered—There's no speed limit sign on my street, or I've driven a mile or so in the city and haven't seen a speed sign.... What's the speed limit? That's actually a really good question, and you might not know if you've never asked the question. The short answer is 25 mph, unless otherwise posted. Specifically, "... it is unlawful for the operator of any motor vehicle to operate the same at a speed in excess of twenty-five miles per hour upon the streets of the city, other than school zones. It is further unlawful for the operator of any motor vehicle to operate the same upon the state highways and state frontage roads within the city limits at a speed in excess of that established and fixed by the Washington State Highway Commission."

Our officers exercise a great deal of discretion, grace, and "enforcement through education" when it comes to speed enforcement. MOST speed enforcement takes place in school zones where speed limits are clearly posted or in an area where a motorist would have had to speed past a posted speed limit sign. Even then, the majority of Kalama traffic stops end in verbal warnings. At the end of the day, we all want safe roadways for motorists and pedestrians. STATE UTILITY MORATORIUM

The State Utility Moratorium has been extended to September 30, 2021 and will not be extended again. While it prohibited utility services from being disconnected for non-payment, it did not relieve customers from the obligation to pay for the utility services. Once lifted, the City will continue to work with customers provided they communicate and act in good faith to resolve any past due balances. Failure to communicate or adhere to any agreement made will result in further actions such as additional fees, disconnection of service, or other legal remedies. We urge all customers to contact us as soon as possible but no later than September 30, 2021, or services may be disconnected, or liens filed on property for which a bill is outstanding and has been for 3 months or more.

The City can set up a payment plan for the past due balance that will spread the payments out for a period of 3 months up to a maximum of 18 months depending on the amount of the outstanding balance, the average monthly bill, and reasonable amount the customer feels they can pay. Late fees are waived during the period covered by the payment plan, provided timely payments are made. If you are a renter, the landlord will need to approve the payment plan prior to finalization.

During the pandemic, the federal and state governments have offered programs to help citizens pay for rent and utilities. We urge customers to apply. There are still funds available; see below for a list of local programs that may be able to extend assistance to you or your business.
