RECYCLING & YARD DEBRIS SERVICE IN KALAMA?



The City is considering contracting for additional curbside services with our current garbage provider — Waste Connections dba Waste Control. In addition to the weekly curbside garbage service, the City is looking at options for curbside recycling and yard debris removal.

Conditions of recycling & yard debris services:

- All City residents would pay for the service, whether they utilize it or not.
- Each City residence would have 3 separate carts.
- Recycling & yard debris carts would be **picked up every other week**.
- The recycling and yard debris carts are each 95-gallon carts.
- Recycling: No glass. Cans, paper, and plastics (bottles, jugs, tubs) are acceptable.
- Yard debris: Items must fit in container, limbs no larger than 4 inches in diameter, no sod, no dirt, no large rock.

What will it cost?

The City will do the billing for services, just like it currently does, for garbage removal. There is a 15% franchise fee (listed as the "overhead" amount). Please note these numbers are estimates and are based on a ten-year contract with Waste Connections.

UTILITY RATE INCREASES

The new year is here, and the new utility rates for water, sewer, and stormwater are effective with the readings for January 2022 per the Council's passing of Ordinances 1467,1468,1469. The overall utility increase is from 3.12% to 3.75% (depending upon water usage). An average bill for 600 cubic feet of water will increase by \$6.81, while an average bill for 1000 cubic feet of water will increase by \$7.70. The City Council also increased the low-income discount for water and sewer which, for usage of 600 cubic feet, saves \$1.10 from the increase. The City Council recognizes the City's high sewer rates and adopted a hybrid rate which increases the sewer consumption charges by only \$0.10 per hundred cubic feet. The increases are required to meet the inflationary costs of providing services, maintaining the system and improvements to replace aging infrastructure, and to meet future demands and growth.

FATS, OILS, & GREASE

The holidays are a good time to remind you of the proper way to dispose of oils, fats, and grease. Butter, gravy, cooking oil, and salad dressing all fall into the category of a fat, oil, or grease. As a liquid, they look harmless so many people dispose of these substances down the drain. When they cool, however, they become thick and sticky, adhering to the pipes of your sewer system and potentially causing clogs, backups, and sewer overflows. Here are some tips to help:

- **1. Wipe.** Remove grease from pots, pans, and dishes with a scraper or paper towel and discard it in the trash.
- **2. Pour.** Discard cooled cooking oil or grease in a secure container. Use a metal can, such as a coffee or soup can. Never pour it down the drain or garbage disposal.
- **3. Trash.** Put all cooled, discarded cooking oil or grease in the trash.
