#### **BUDGET UPDATE**

It's budget time for the City of Kalama, once again. Going into 2023 the City is experiencing the same inflation as the citizens and business owners with some costs more than tripling. The City passes increased costs to its consumers in the same way businesses pass their increases forward to their customers. This is a difficult decision for staff and the Council, but *it is the City's responsibility to provide and maintain necessary services to the public* such as clean drinking water as well as sanitary and storm sewer.

Based on the need to cover inflationary increases, City staff is recommending to the Council that the full 1% increase—as allowed by law—be adopted for property taxes which would include the banked capacity from previous years. In previous years, sales tax revenue was greater due to large, multi-million-dollar construction projects such as the new middle and elementary schools. So far in 2022, the amounts received by the city have fallen 6% as the number of projects has significantly decreased. The property tax is the only revenue source the City directly controls. A 1% increase *does not meet* the inflationary demands for the Police, Library, Finance, Streets, and general operating costs of the City, but is the legal limit of increase, without a vote of the

citizens. The City will realize additional revenues from other tax sources due to inflationary increases to the base revenue sources.

For the Last 2 years, Council has been conservative with rate increases due to the pandemic. Although the pandemic is still ongoing, the infrastructure has surpassed its normal life expectancy and needs additional maintenance. **Staff is recommending** a 9.5% increase to water rates, a 5.5% increase to sewer rates, and a 9.5% increase to stormwater rates. This means for a customer using 600 cubic feet of water in a month (the average for a 2-person household) they will see a combined increase of \$10.42 per month. Kalama currently has the *lowest water rates in the SW* Washington region and is in the mid-range for the total cost of utilities in Cowlitz County for 2022. To help consumers with low-income, staff is recommending an increase to the income threshold for the low-income discount. This will allow customers at somewhat higher income levels to qualify for the discount. There will be more budget updates in next month's edition. **Public Hearings:** 

- ➤ 2023 Revenues- October 20, 2022 @ 7pm where additional information will be presented, and public testimony will be taken.
- ➤ 2023 Draft expenditure budget for all departments- scheduled for November
