## The View From City Hall

City Hall functions like a "help desk" for many residents and visitors. It's the hub of city operations the citizen's point of access to the local government representatives. Kalama City Hall is comprised of multiple departments including:

- Clerk/Treasurer's Office
  - Public meetings- Support for boards and commissions
  - City code, ordinances, & resolutions
  - o Public records
  - Communications public noticing, publications, curate social media and website content
  - Financial & Asset management, tax reporting, financial reporting, bonds, insurance, etc.
  - Compliance Measures Federal, State, and City levels
- City Administrator's Office
  - Provides administrative support for the mayor
  - o Manager for Department Heads
  - o Community & Economic Development
  - Land Use Code and Planning Commission strategy
  - Future planning- infrastructure & financial
  - Interlocal agreements
- Utilities (water, sewer, garbage, and stormwater)
- Building, Planning, & Permitting
- Human Resources & Payroll
- Accounts Payable & Accounts Receivable
- Parks Programs & Community Services (community building rentals)
- Pet Licensing and special permits

From applying for grant funding to maintaining interlocal agreements and utility billing to scheduling building inspections—city hall staff does the bulk of the "behind the scenes" work. City Hall staff's mission is to balance legal requirements and fiscal responsibilities of city government while also working to prepare the city to meet the challenges of the future, encouraging progress and growth with a respect for the history of Kalama.

The City Council approved the budget for 2023 to include a new crew member for public works. In February, the crew welcomed a new technician: Tom Wright! ## How to Protect Your Child from Cyberbullying

Cyberbullying often occurs when a child uses the Internet, emails, text messages, social media websites, chat rooms, or other digital technology to harass, threaten, or humiliate another child. As our society continues to witness, cyberbullying can cause feelings of devastation and may lead to traumatic incidents.

While some parents may feel limited in ways they can protect their child from such taunting, there are steps you can take to end (or prevent) this type of abuse. If you discover your child is being bullied, it is important to teach him or her not to react or retaliate. In addition, you should block the "bully," and print out and keep evidence in case it is ever needed. We also encourage you to follow these tips:

- Keep your computer in easily viewable places.
- Talk regularly with your child about online activities that he or she is involved in.
- Tell your child that you may review his or her online communications if you think there is reason for concern.
- Consider installing parental control filtering software and/or tracking programs.
- Educate your child about the consequences of inappropriate use of his or her electronics, such as losing internet access or use of their cell phone.
