The View From City Hall- Utility Department

One of the main functions of Kalama's City Hall is its utility department that facilitates services and billing for water, sewer, garbage, and stormwater accounts. Kiley Mirenta is Kalama's "Utility Clerk". She manages the utility meter reading and billing software; calculates and processes leak adjustments; and provides general customer service for utility users both inside and outside of the city. If you ever call City Hall to speak to the utility department, Kiley is probably the person on the other end of the phone.

Kiley manages the billing for over 2,200 utility accounts. Did you know your water meter is read by radio waves which send a signal to the meter to collect the data that shows how much water your household consumes? Kiley verifies the settings on this device and loads the route for monthly reading before public works drives around and collects the readings. Sometimes customers will request a "data log" to show excess water use on their account at a more detailed level-- such as daily or hourly consumption. The data log can help a

customer identify what might be causing a leak on their property. She facilitates these data log requests and discusses the findings with the customer. She often advocates for customers to receive a leak adjustment for leaks which qualify under City policy.

Kiley sets up new customer accounts, prepares final bills for customers moving out of the area, and deals with late and delinquent accounts. She also processes water shut offs (in accordance with the Kalama Municipal Code) for customers who have not paid their bills. She works with customers to change out garbage carts, handles missed garbage pickups, and coordinates with Waste Control regarding placement for new development. All of these functions require a vast knowledge of the Kalama Municipal Code and state laws regarding utility collections and services.

Utility & Payroll Clerk, Kiley Mirenta

Although the utility billing department is a full-time job, Kiley has additional responsibilities city-wide. She is the "Payroll Clerk" that processes payroll for all city staff and the elected officials 2 times each month. In the last year, the City has moved to automated timekeeping, and Kiley coordinated the transition to integrate the payroll software with the biometric time clocks.

She is expanding into a broader human resource function for the city, which will include acting as "safety officer" and "claims manager". She has been working with City administration to develop employee policies that are currently being reviewed by the City Council in small batches. In late spring she will be implementing the new asset management program and will be working closely with public works to map the drinking water and wastewater treatment facilities within this software.

Kiley is a vital asset to the City team. She continues to work efficiently and provides professional service to the citizens. Kiley is a mother of 3 boys. In her free time, she loves to play video games, go hiking, and spend time with her kids and fiancé. Her favorite place is Disneyland-- she's always planning her next trip to the "happiest place on earth". Kiley says her favorite part of her job is interacting with the customers.


