Summer Sewer Averaging has Ended

Notice for sewer customers: As of September 22nd, the summer sewer averaging for utility bills has ended. The bill issued 10/1 is for services from mid-August through mid-September (which was based on summer sewer averaging).

Reminder: Summer Sewer Averaging is effective from the middle of May to the middle of September. Outside of that, every drop of water has a sewer charge that goes with it. Prepare for Colder Weather

With fall and winter right around the corner, the public works department recommends winterizing sprinkler systems and protecting outside spigots to avoid frozen or damaged pipes. Public Works also recommends that homeowners clean their roofs and gutters to prepare for the upcoming rainy season. If you have a storm drain on your street, they are asking that you keep an eye on it to make sure it does not plug with leaves. 
