Welcome Councilmember Deb Geiger

Deb Geiger spent the first 30(ish) years of her life in different parts of sunny Arizona. Graduating from Northern Arizona University at the onset of the 2008 recession didn't lend itself to jumping right into her career choice of teaching, so she spent a couple years traveling the world. She visited South America, Oceana, Southeast Asia and a great deal of Europe doing everything from nannying, teaching English, working on farms, and bartending at hostels to make ends meet and allow her to continue her travels.

Deb has always had an entrepreneurial spirit. She was the opening manager of her first business- a coffee shop in Flagstaff AZ at age 20. Upon returning from her travels, she spent a great deal of time working in high end restaurants in Scottsdale Arizona, which fueled her love of operating small businesses.

In 2015, life changed abruptly with a diagnosis of breast cancer. She spent the better part of a year in surgeries, chemo and radiation and when she was on the other side, it was again time to hit the road. Deb traveled to Bali to get her yoga teacher certification, and upon completion decided to move to the pacific northwest. In 2018, her and her parents invested in a building in Kalama and have been renovating, and

operating it as an event space/hub for small businesses ever since. It is used by several small businesses around town for community classes (like Deb's yoga class!) during the week, and on the weekend is rented out for parties and events.

Deb started subbing in the Kalama School District as soon as she moved here, but has been a full time teacher at the high school since 2021. She finally seems settled for the long haul, with a wedding and a baby on the way! She's looking forward to learning all things city council and we welcome her to the team!



Utility Rate Changes - 2024

Customers will see an increase in their utility bills for January (billing date, February 1). The Council authorized an increase to the usage rates for water and sewer consumption. The Base rates will remain the same as in 2023. The increase will average approximately 3.5% for the average household. Increases are necessary to meet the rising costs of operating and maintaining the systems. The increase is dependent on the amount of water used. This allows customers to maintain some control over the increase with conservation measures, avoiding extra usage, and maintaining their plumbing and fixtures. The combined cost for water and sewer plus utility taxes is \$0.20 per gallon of water used. Visit the link or scan the QR code for a utility comparison worksheet:

Thank You Public Works


